Measure Twice Cut Once

Quality Assurance (QA) has many steps for a good electric motor reliability program. A great first step is testing a newly arrived or recently repaired motor prior to acceptance. The data collected is vital in establishing the initial health of the motor. But, does QA end after acceptance testing? No. Remember when you install the motor into the circuit it is still necessary to take another set of baseline tests to ensure all connections are complete and tight. Now that the motor is installed into the system, you can set your baseline and trend all subsequent tests.
