Eccentricity Tests with VFD's or RVSS's

The Air Gap fault zone is analyzed and trended with the Eccentricity Capture. Determinations about the motor's Air Gap can be made by evaluating the odd multiple sidebands of the line frequency that develop around the eccentricity frequency: $\text{RPM} \times \# \text{ Rotor Bars} / \text{Line frequency}$. Tests can be performed and evaluated accurately by knowing exactly what line frequency is being supplied to the motor. Remember a VFD's output can be higher or lower than specified on your motor's nameplate. A RVSS will usually output an un-manipulated line frequency as supplied to the facility.
